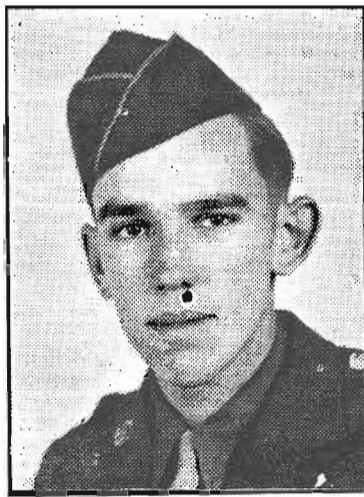




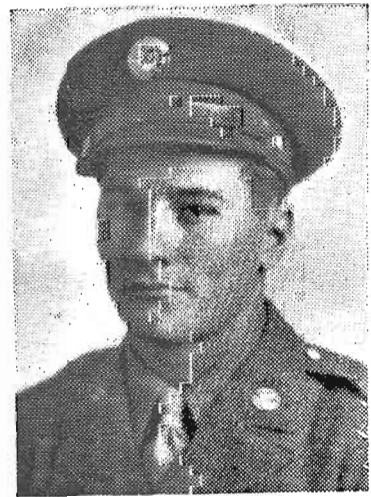
UVAL J. HEBERT
